Sociologist from the Universidad del Valle (Colombia, 1998) and PhD in Sociology from the School of Social, Legal and Educational Studies at Queen's University of Belfast (Northern Ireland, 2005).

She began her academic career as a research assistant at the Institute for the prevention of violence and promotion of peace (CISALVA) in Universidad del Valle (Colombia) where she gained experience on social research and interdisciplinary approaches to public health problems. After completing her Doctoral

studies and serving as lecturer and researcher in several local Universities in Colombia, she joined the Department of Social Sciences at the Pontificia Universidad Javeriana - Cali in 2009, where she taught in undergraduate (psychology, communication and media studies, law) and graduate programmes (health psychology, family studies, public policy, public health), and tutored over 20 dissertation projects. Her teaching areas included sociology and social theory, qualitative research, sexuality, and sexual and reproductive health.

As a researcher, she has participated in over 15 projects both as P.I. and CO-I and is part of top ranking Wellbeing, Work, Culture and Society Research Group (Bitacus) in the area of Families, Gender and Sexuality. Her research focuses on teenage and youth socialization, with an emphasis on voluntary risk taking, sexuality, sexual diversity and gender equality, as well as sexual and reproductive rights, public health and well-being. Her publications include 15 articles, 3 books and 10 book chapters. She has been a consultant for the Ministry of Health and Social Protection, the United Nations.

As academic leader and manager, she served as Director of the Research, Innovation and Development Office between 2015 and 2018, and as Dean of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences between 2018 and 2023.

In December 2023 she joined the Department of Social Work and Social Policy of the Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences at the University of Strathclyde, in Glasgow (UK). As Teaching Associate, she is part of the academic team supporting the B.A. in Education and Social Services.
