International Relations

- 1. Describe history and specific of international relations as a field of study and explain the relation of international relations to political science. Explain key aspects of international relations; explain the concept of national interest.
- 2. Define following structural concepts of IR: hierarchy, anarchy, polarity, symmetry and asymmetry, centrum and periphery.
- 3. Comprehensively analyze the first debate in IR theory (key theories and topics, main authors). Briefly introduce the second, third and fourth debate in IR theory.
- 4. Introduce basic concepts of international security and focus primarily on the process of broadening the concept of security itself.
- 5. Analyze the following international security concepts: collective defense, collective security, security concert.
- 6. Analyze the following international security concepts common security, neutrality, non-alignment..
- 7. Analyze the issue of international organizations (definitions, typology of international organizations using several dimensions, role and function of international organizations in international relations).
- 8. Analyze the workings of the United Nations (from historical and contemporary perspective), introduce its institutional structure, and elaborate on the possible future reform of the UN.
- 9. Classify wars according to dimensions of space, time, intensity and methods of fighting. Lit specifics of civil wars and shortly assess the concept of just war.
- 10. Introduce the concept of humanitarian law. Elaborate on relevant definition of military conflict, its typology and key causes of war in academic literature.
- 11. Introduce periodization of history of the international system; characterize each phase and identify possible breaking points. Focus primarily on the first systemic period.
- 12. Analyze the workings of the European concert in the 19th century. Briefly describe key players and ideas behind the concert.

- 13. Analyze the development of international relations since end of WWII until 1925, explaining key events and actors involved. Assess attempts to reform international relations after the Great War.
- 14. Analyze the development of international relations since the beginning of the Great Depression until eruption of WWII., explaining key events and actors involved..
- 15. Present basic characteristic and phases of the colonization process, including economic theoretical explanations. List main colonial powers and the extent of their empires.
- 16. Analyze the process of decolonization, its development and the most important impacts. Introduce a periodization of the decolonization process.
- 17. Analyze the roots of the Cold War and institutional development of international politics after WWII. List key events in international politics between 1945 and 1962.
- 18. List the key events in international politics during 1962–1991. Analyze the impact of the events you have selected.
- 19. Describe the ideological bipolarity between USSR and the United States during the Cold War.
- 20. Describe key aspects of terrorism in contemporary international relations definitions of terrorism, key authors, typology and periodization of terrorism.
- 21. Analyze security threats for post-communist countries in Central and Eastern Europe.
- 22. Analyze the security environment in contemporary Asia.
- 23. Analyze the security environment in contemporary Africa.
- 24. Analyze the security environment in contemporary Latin America and describe the development of relations between the United States and the Latin American region.
