We are also interested in projects exploring innovative methods of teaching philosophy and fostering critical thinking.

We are seeking a postdoctoral researcher working at the intersection of history and digital humanities, with a focus on the application of digital and computational methods to historical research. Applicants are expected to hold a completed PhD in history, digital humanities, or a related field, to have a publication record appropriate to their early career stage, and to demonstrate an ability to integrate historical research questions with digital methods. We particularly welcome applicants with experience in the digital processing of textual and visual historical sources, for example using HTR/OCR, text mining, natural language processing (NLP), artificial intelligence, or large language models (LLMs), and/or with expertise in the 3D digitisation and analysis of tangible cultural heritage through photogrammetry, 3D scanning, the creation and analysis of 3D models, or spatial data. Experience in the processing and interpretation of ego-documents, database and knowledge graph development, network or spatial analysis, or other Digital Humanities methods would also be an advantage. The successful applicant will contribute to the further development of the methodological framework of the Centre for the History of Everyday Life, apply digital methods to corpora of historical sources, and participate in the preparation of collaborative grant proposals and publications.
