





MY STUDENT EXCHANGE EXPERIENCE

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
GHANA

My expectations were, indeed, really high: I expected to see a beautiful country, to meet gifted and talented international students, to have an academic experience that would expand my horizon in my study area and create opportunities for further advanced studies and research. On the flip side, however, I initially harboured lowered expectations relative to racial discrimination, considering the fact that I am black and proudly black.





Largely, my expectations were met: the Czech Republic is a beautiful country, with some very beautiful cities and breath-taking architecture, especially in Prague. I found Hradec Králové very well-designed, very neat, and most importantly, very peaceful. The Erasmus program brought me into contact with some exceptional instructors in the Philosophical Faculty who both complemented borders in the study expanded my Philosophy; a most-satisfying experience. Contrary to my fears, I personally didn't experience obvious overt racial or many discrimination: the international students and the locals I interacted with were very welcoming and very much happy to help.

I must admit that 'having fun' wasn't part of my UHK to-do list initially, but I ended up doing some exciting stuff, including city-and-country-hopping, thanks to the Erasmus+ stipend. I got to visit Germany and Hungary and would have loved to travel more, but I could not due to the Covid pandemic and the resultant travel restrictions. On the whole, I have had a wonderful, near-perfect journey learning unlearning, and meeting wonderful people, discovering, and embracing diversity, thanks to the UHK-Erasmus+ program, which I would gladly recommend to anyone who wants to experience the University of Hradec Králové and the Czech Republic.
