I feel like I was constantly financially stressed when in Erasmus, which is horrible because the inflation was always growing and especially the price of food was rising.

The Czech Republic it's beautiful, but their population as a big difficulty with English foreigners, most people above 30 years old can't understand English at all and I found them being rude because of it, me not understanding them always made things like travelling or just enjoying normal services really uncomfortable experiences.

Nevertheless, I was able to enjoy some good moments in UHK. It is a faculty with a really good quality of teaching and good facilities. The professors are extremely qualified in their field and I always found myself being respected and my problems being taken in consideration by them, which made the student experience great.

I had the opportunity to find really good friends (also from Erasmus) that I hold in my heart and also to learn a ton of things about their culture, and that was a fulfilling experience for me.
