## CALL for Erasmus+ Student Mobilities for Traineeship in the academic year 2026/2027

Philosophical Faculty of the University of Hradec Králové invites applications (=students of degree programmes in English at FF UHK) for the selection process of Erasmus+ Mobility for Traineeship in the academic year 2026/2027.

**Mobility period:** at least 2 months, maximum 12 months

**Destinations:** Denmark, Finland, Ireland, Iceland, Lichtenstein, Luxembourg, Norway, Sweden, Belgium; France; Italy, Cyprus, Malta, Germany, Netherlands, Portugal, Austria, Greece, Spain, Bulgaria, Estonia, Croatia, Lithuania, Latvia, Hungary (ask for more details), Macedonia, Poland, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia, Serbia, Turkey

**Erasmus financial support:** between 690 and 810 EUR per month, depending on the destination.

**Selection criteria:** language skills, current academic results, and the relevance of the practical internship to the applicant's field of study.

**Apply via STAG - My studies - ECTS departures,** please add the following documents:

CV – in a language of the traineeship, extent max. 2 A4, pdf format, name of the file is CV\_ surname

Invitation letter from the future employer (with dates and content of the traineeship)

Transcript of Records – from STAG system, pdf format, name of the file is STAG\_ surname

The applications are accepted during the whole year until the allocated budget has been spent. The selection procedure (oral interview) will take place approximately within 14 days of submitting the application. We recommend submitting your mobility application well in advance (at least 2.5 months before the planned start of the mobility).

The mobility stay is subject to the current epidemiological and security situation. FF UHK reserves the right to postpone or cancel the mobility.
