Promoting inclusion & diversity

UHK supports promoting equal opportunities and access, inclusion, diversity, and equity as a part of its activities. The university's actions at various levels target participants with limited opportunities. Care for these students at the UHK is provided university-wide by the UHK point which provides counselling services, especially in the framework of the Augustin programme for supporting students with specific needs and the Open UHK programme. The university:

- communicates intensively with partner institutions on inclusion and equal access,
- is registered on the inclusivemobility.eu platform and presents its support offers for international students there,
- provides wheelchair-accessible facilities in the university's buildings. The UHK point regularly monitors the condition of the buildings and the needs

of its visitors,

- seeks specific measures to facilitate the arrival and stay at the UHK for students with limited opportunities,
- also offers virtual and combined types of mobility to ensure inclusion in mobilities.

Supporting digital transformation

The university supports the use of digital technologies for teaching, education, science and research. UHK actively contributes to the development of digital skills and digital literacy of students and staff in the following ways:

- uses advanced online communication, which is applied at all stages of contact with students

- offers students opportunities to enhance their digital competencies through courses, training or workshops,
- offers the possibility to participate in virtual or combined mobilities.

 includes activities to promote sustainability in the field of mobilities in university initiatives and events.
